

2 Venue

Main venue: Except for the banquet on Saturday night, the whole event is held at:


Télécom ParisTech, 46 rue Barrault, Paris

The main gate will be open from 8:00 to 18:00 on both days.




When entering by the Entrance on rue Barrault, you arrive at the Entrance Hall (in magenta), where coffee breaks will be held. The Secondary Auditorium is immediately accessible: leave your coat and bags there. You can also use the Staircase to access Level 1 (with the auditorium) and Level 2 (with the computer labs). Coaches can also access the Coaches' Room (in dark green) where they can stay during the contest.

Here is a map of Level 1 and Level 2 of the building that you can reach with the Staircase ...



Access to the school canteen is trickier: get to **Level 2** in Building C, climb one floor up to **Level 3**, cross the long corridor of **Level 3** in Building C, climb one floor up to **Level 4**, you have arrived.



Bars or restaurants in the neighborhood of Télécom ParisTech: Right next to our school, there are plenty of restaurants and bars in the rue de la Butte aux Cailles, the rue des Cinq Diamants and the neighbouring streets. You will meet there a young, trendy and festive Parisian crowd. Keep your eyes open as the district of la Butte aux Cailles is also home to the local street art scene. For a restaurant district not too far, you can also check the *Latin Quarter* (e.g., rue Mouffetard, rue de Saint-Séverin, etc.), which is 30 minutes away by foot. For traditional *crêpes*, check rue du Montparnasse and rue de la Gaîté. For Asian food, check avenue de Choisy.

Banquet venue: The banquet is held at *Paris Marriott Rive Gauche Hotel & Conference Center*. It is located near Télécom ParisTech at 17, boulevard Saint-Jacques. The banquet will take place on the third floor, starting at 19:00.

Please make sure to bring your badge so that you can be identified as a participant.

You can reach the banquet venue from Télécom ParisTech by foot in about 5-10 minutes (sadly the route is not especially scenic this year). Use your best shortest path algorithm from the green pin to the red pin on the map.



3 Practical information

3.1 Cloak room and streaming

The Secondary auditorium will be open and watched by a volunteer to serve as cloak room. It is immediately accessible from the Entrance Hall on the ground floor. We strongly recommend that you leave your jacket and bag(s) in the cloak room to be more comfortable in the Auditorium.

Remember that you will not be permitted to bring any bag to the contest floor. In any case, we recommend that you leave any valuable items or electronic devices at your hotel or with your coach during the contest.

The main contest events in the Auditorium will also streamed to the Secondary auditorium in case you want to watch them in a less crowded atmosphere. The stream will also be available online for people to watch remotely (see https://swerc.eu/ for details).

3.2 Lunches

Lunches will be served at the school canteen (Building C, last floor).

Saturday: The canteen will serve food from 12:30 to 14:00. You can go at any time or, if you prefer to cooperate to avoid queues, you can respect the time indicated on your dedicated information sheet. ;-) The information sheet also gives all necessary information about the meal arrangements. Please ask a volunteer if you have food allergies or other special needs.

Sunday: The canteen will serve a packed lunch from 13:30 to 15:00. We invite coaches to go before 14:00 and contestants to go once the contest is over. Meat and vegetarian options will be offered (on a first-come first-served basis).

Sponsors: Our sponsors will be at their booths in the Entrance Hall during the lunch breaks: this is the perfect time to chat with them.

4 Contest

Regulations. Please refer to https://swerc.eu/2018/regulations/ for details about applicable regulations. Here is a summary of the most important rules:

- Please wear your **t-shirt** on top and **badge** at all times during the contest.
- No electronic devices are permitted in the contest area, including keyboards, phones, smartwatches, laptops, calculators. Team members must leave all electronic devices with their coach prior to entering the contest area. Teams found with electronic devices will be disqualified.
- No communication is permitted between contestants during the contest, except between members of the same team when seated at their desk. Any attempt to communicate across teams will lead to disqualification.
- No printed materials or paper are permitted in the contest area, except your Team Reference Document as installed by us, and the draft paper, problem statements, and printouts that we will provide.
- Any activity that jeopardizes the contest may lead to disqualification. This includes attempts to access the Internet, excessive printing, abuse of system resources, etc.
- Please bring your own pens, mascots, etc., to the contest area on Saturday during practice, and leave them there for the contest on Sunday. No additional materials can be brought to the contest area on Sunday. Likewise, do not take Team Reference Documents away on Saturday (but do take them away on Sunday).
- All questions about problems should be asked via the DOMjudge contest control system. Any problem with the computing environment should be reported to the volunteers onsite.
